Treasurer's Report

Well, I was right that the weather couldn't be worse than last year. It rained throughout Carnival Day but unlike 2007, the park was not saturated by rain in the weeks leading up to Carnival so the stallholders were able to setup, and there were no high winds to prevent the stage going up. The stage show this year was truly fantastic, with everyone giving great performances. My personal favourites where the dance groups from London, whose sets were heart pounding high energy, and the sweet reggae sounds of Yaz Alexander. We were also treated to great performances from our local DJ's.

We have ended the year with a small surplus and a reasonably healthy bank balance. There has been no increase in grant support from Reading Borough Council (RBC) for more than six years so this has been achieved with additional sponsorship, additional support-in-kind from RBC and cost savings. For example, the cost of the Marquee was halved this year by changing the supplier; also the King and Queen Dance was scaled down with ticket and drink sales just about covering the costs. Carnival was again awarded an Arts Council Grant to improve the artistic content of Carnival. A series of costume making workshops were run in the weeks leading up to Carnival Day. Also, payments were made to Steel and Mas Bands taking part in the Procession and to some of the performers on stage. The grant was also used to cover some of the costs of staging the Children's evening which was completely free to everyone who attended. In the current financial climate we have all seen a rise in our personally expenditures, it is therefore inevitable that the coming year will see a rise in Carnival costs as well. The Committee will therefore have to work hard to secure additional funding and sponsorship.

On a personal note, I have been Carnival Treasurer for the past six years and have enjoyed the experience. However, I no longer work in Reading and I am finding it more and more difficult to achieve everything I need to achieve. I have therefore decided that this will be the final year that I will be prepared to be nominated as Carnival Treasurer.
