Report: Treasurer

The sun came out for Carnival 2009 and it was definitely one of the best. The weather was hot, the costumes were hot, and the stage performances were hot. It was hot, hot, hot!

The hot and thirsty revellers drank all the beer, water and rum punch in the Committee's refreshment marquee making a profit of £791. This year's carnival dance was held at the Jazz Club. Those of you who attended the event were treated to a great night and helped us to make a fantastic profit of £718. Thanks are due to the Jazz Club, who provided the venue free of charge, the DJ's who donated their time, and to new committee member David Williams who organised it all. The Committee also ran the free carnival workshops in the 10 weeks leading up to Carnival day, and the free Children's Carnival Party at the Mapp Centre both of which would not have been a success without Carnival Artist Hilman Philbert.

Our income was reduced this year as there was no Lottery funding or monetary sponsorship and it was necessary to dip into the reserves built up over the pass few years. An application was made to Reading Borough Council (RBC) for an increase of £5,000 in the Core Funding grant but received just £20. RBC has in previous years paid for the generators used on Carnival day but the Committee was asked to pay the £2,762 bill, which has further reduced our reserves.

Due to an under-spend of around 10% on the budget for our 2008 grant application, the Arts Council did not pay the remaining £500 of the grant and this has had to be written-off. Usually, the Arts Council requires that any under-spend is repaid, however such is our reputation with the council that we were allowed to retain this money to be spent in 2009. The remaining lottery money was used to fund the workshops, to assist Mas and Steel bands to participate in the procession to increase the artistic content, and to stage the children's carnival party.

Carnival's long standing suppliers such as Sabre (PA equipment) and S and C (Security) have maintained their prices for some time but the expectation is that prices will rise over the next few years.

Carnival is also faced with new costs, which could mean the end of Reading Carnival unless the event is properly funded and sponsored in the future.

- In 2008 the Performing Rights Society (PRS) starting billing Carnivals all over the country for the use of music in processions, and on stages. This year Reading Carnival paid £856 fees to PRS for 2008/2009 and 2009/2010. They have now introduced a scheme whereby non-profit making organisation can apply to reduce their payments but acceptance on the scheme seems to be at the whim of PRS.
- The number of policemen at Carnival will be reduced, but they will be on-call in the event of a major incident. This is great news as it underlines the fact that Reading Carnival is trouble free, but it does mean that we will have to employee addition security personnel.
- The police will no longer be responsible for road closures and the committee will have to find volunteers (which based on past experience is unlikely), or pay a company to handle the closures.





I have been based in London for the past two years and can no longer devote the required time to Carnival. I will continue as the webmaster for the website until a replacement is found and I will always be available for assistance and advice.

When I became Treasurer seven years ago my objective was to make Carnival finances clear and able to withstand any scrutiny, and I believe I have achieved this. Also, during this time Reading Carnival Committee has greatly improved its reputation, credibility and trust with suppliers, other community groups, the police and RBC. I have enjoyed my time on the committee and worked with a wonderful group of people to organise some of the best Carnivals in its 32 year history.

I wish the best of luck to the incoming Committee.
